## Dressing Change for PICC or CVC

## **REMOVAL**

- 01 Gather appropriate supplies:
  - Central Line Dressing Change Kit
  - Clean gloves
- 02 Hand hygiene on entry to room, don clean gloves.





- 03 Explain procedure to patient.
- Open kit on clean surface and remove glove packet and mask maintaining kit asepsis.



05 Set gloves aside, off of sterile field.

06 Don mask.



07 Remove dressing by pulling towards the insertion site.




08 Remove Securement device per manufacturer's instructions for use (if applicable) maintaining control of catheter.\*





09 Assess site for signs of infection, drainage. Take note of external length.

10 Remove and discard soiled gloves.



11 Perform hand hygiene.

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## **APPLICATION**

12 Don sterile gloves.



13 Cleanse skin with antiseptic solution (CHG)\*\* using a back and forth motion for 30 seconds.\*



- 14 Allow to completely air dry.\*
- 15 Apply skin protectant (if applicable) to area larger than Securement device anchor pad, allowing to dry to the touch.\*



16 Apply Securement device per manufacturer's instructions for use (if applicable) to:
1) PICC/CVC then
2) patient's skin



17 Apply antimicrobial dressing (if used) following manufacturer's instructions for use.\*



18 Apply dressing to cover the insertion site and catheter bifurcation.



19 Apply pre-cut securement tape strip under the extension legs and over the dressing border.



20 Label dressing with date and initials.



21 Remove gloves, remove mask, and perform hand hygiene.



22 Document procedure in patient record.
